DISTRICT COURT

Roberts v. Ostrum, Yellowstone DV 96-492, 6/11/97.

VERDICT: Defense, intersection auto, minor impact, minor injury.

A 5-1 Billings jury found that Carl Ostrum was negligent in connection with a collision with Patricia Roberts in 11/93, but not a cause of her damages.

Roberts, 18, claimed that Ostrum, 83, failed to yield at Montana Ave. and N. 21st St. in Billings. Ostrum asserted comparative fault and asserted that he was in the lane when struck by Roberts. How the impact occurred was disputed. Ostrum asserted a minor injury from a minor impact and deposed doctors from a subsequent injury to show that Roberts did not suffer from any symptoms 2 years after the accident.

Plaintiff's Expert: neurologist Dale Peterson, Billings (deposed).

Defendant's Expert: ER physician Kathi Theade, Billings (St. Vincent Hospital, deposed); neurologist Scott Callaghan, Billings (deposed).

Original demand, \$18,000; original offer, \$10,000 in mediation before Russell Fillner. Final demand, \$15,000; final offer, 0.

Jury request, \$10,000; jury suggestion, \$3,000 (if anything).

Jury deliberated 1½ hours 3rd day; Judge Holmstrom.
