#### **THE CASE**

This is a product liability action against the manufacturer of a truck chassis that was put into service as a garbage truck. Plaintiff was employed by a garbage collection service and was assisting a route driver in residential garbage pickup. After emptying garbage into the collection can on the front of the truck, he stepped onto the passenger side step and fell when the truck started moving. Plaintiff suffered severe injuries. Neither the driver nor the plaintiff can explain how the fall happened. Plaintiff claims the truck chassis was defective because 1) the design of the cab steps is faulty as it invites a worker to ride on the steps but does not provide sufficient handholds or a secure place for feet; and 2) the manufacturer failed to place a warning on the side of the cab.

There are significant challenges for both sides of the case, and the exercise for counsel is to make the most of the facts given under the law in this jurisdiction against a backdrop of serious injuries.
